

Language Analysis

For the language analysis, you will complete an observation of a child between 18 and 48 months old. You may choose from one of the recordings on the course website (under Language Analysis) or you may record and analyze your own or a friend's child's speech provided the child is between 18 and 48 months.

You will write a paper¹ on this child's phonological, morphological, syntactic, semantic, and pragmatic skills, defining what each of these means. You must include the Mean Length Utterance (MLU) and explain what it indicates. You will calculate the child's speech rate as well. For more details on how to do this, please see the "Child Language Analysis Checklist." Finally, you will give your overall impression of the child's language skills (normally developing, delayed, etc.), and justify your opinion with specific examples/calculations.

There are a series of tests available on the course website. You are welcome to use any of these that you find helpful though none are required.
